# City of Auburn Monday, November 16, 2020 Minutes

Mayor Berola called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

## I. Mayor's Comments

The Mayor indicated that tonight's meeting will happen via ZOOM Teleconferencing due to statewide COVID-19 pandemic. It was determined that an in-person meeting is not practical or prudent because of the risk of exposure to the COVID-19 virus stemming from an indoor gathering, and that the remote meeting is in the best interest of the health, safety, and welfare of the council, staff, and general public.

## Filling of Ward I Alderman Vacancy

Mayor Berola informed the Council that he would like to recommend Mike Marquis, former City of Auburn police officer, to the vacant Ward I Alderman position. Marquis has worked for the City of Auburn and knows the City.

Motion by Johnson second by Royer to appoint Mike Marquis to the vacant Ward I Alderman position effective immediately. (7-0-0-0)

#### II. VISITORS/PUBLIC COMMENTS

A. Jessica Lance – Backyard Chickens and Sales Tax Rebate

Although Jessica Lance was not able to be on-line, Mayor Berola informed the Council that she was wanting to talk about the non-binding chicken referendum that was passed during the November election. Berola shared with the Council that Attorney Moredock is working on a draft ordinance for the Council to review. One example was shared with the ordinance that the City of Washington Illinois enforcing. Alderman Garrett pointed out that the City of Washington is not even comparable to the size of Auburn. Alderman Karhliker asked how we would handle the subdivision covenants that are in place. Karhliker indicated he didn't know if the City would override them or not. Mayor Berola informed the Council that all this needs to be looked into. Attorney Moredock will be doing some research on processes in place that have been successful.

Jessica Lance also had inquired about the sales tax rebate for her new business after a year of existence. Mayor Berola shared with the Council that she is entitled to 1% of the City's collected tax portion from her business. Office Manager Kristy Ponsler is working with her on this matter.

Donna Moldenhaur, representing Trinity Lutheran Church, was online and is inquiring about the possibility of closing Van Buren Street from 11<sup>th</sup> Street to 104 directly behind Trinity Lutheran Church. Trinity Lutheran Church will be doing a drive by Nativity scene on Saturday, December 12, from 5-8 p.m. Mayor Berola informed her that it would not be a problem and he would talk with Superintendent TJ Henson to make that happen.

## **Campbell**

Chief Dave Campbell informed the Council that the City of Auburn Police Department has received another grant for traffic detail from the Illinois Department of Transportation.

## <u>Henson</u>

Superintendent TJ Henson informed the Council that the person they intended to hire for the vacant position of Garage Laborer did not work out. Henson indicated that after looking into other candidates he recommends to the Council the hiring of Chad Smith, pending background check, for the vacant position of Garage Laborer. Alderman Garrett indicated that he had heard that a number of people had been offered the position and had for one reason or another turned it down. Alderman Garrett asked Superintendent Henson if he would like to reopen the application process to seek additional candidates. Henson indicated while he felt it would be ok to open the applications back up, he was satisfied with offering Chad Smith this position as he needed the manpower now.

Motion by Johnson second by Royer to hire Chad Smith, pending back ground check, to the vacant position of Garage Laboror at a pay rate set by union contract and will begin as soon as he provides notice to his current employer. (7-1-0-0)

## **Ponsler**

Office Manager Kristy Ponsler indicated that she did not have a report except for hoping Alderman Johnson will reschedule the previously cancelled Administration Committee.

## A. Administration – Johnson

Alderman Johnson informed the Council that he does need to schedule the previously cancelled Administration Committee Meeting as Officer Manager Ponsler indicated. He would like to set a ZOOM meeting for Monday, December 7, 2020 at 6:15 p.m. to discuss personnel, annexation and clerk software.

## Public Works – Karhliker

Alderman Karhliker indicated that he did not have a report at this time.

#### Public Utilities – Johnson

Alderman Johnson informed the Council that a request for loan disbursement from the IEPA on the Illinois Water Resolving Loan Fund in the amount of \$663,788.96 has been received and needs to be approved.

Motion by Johnson second by Hemmerle to approve the Auburn IEPA Reimbursement payment in the amount of \$663,788.96. (8-0-0-0)

Alderman Johnson also informed the Council that Attorney Moredock needs to draft an ordinance for Utility Fee for Repayment. The cost is \$10.78 per month per water customer and Alderman Johnson is recommending it to be \$11.00 per month per water customer. This additional cost will need to begin in January 2021. That would allow one full year before the city has to make repayment.

#### Health & Safety – Sheppard

Alderwoman Sheppard informed the Council that because of the Covid 19 pandemic, they should be considering banning burning until further notice. Mayor Berola indicated that he agrees with Alderwoman Sheppard and feels that the City should keep the Lost Caboose open for residents. Alderman Garrett did reiterate that you can have a personal fire pit where you burn sticks but leaves and grass clippings are not allowed.

Motion by Garrett second by Royer to ban burning of leaves and grass clippings indefinitely and will be reexamined in the Spring of 2021. (8-0-0-0)

#### Health & Housing – Sheppard

Alderwoman Sheppard informed the Council that the North Grand property has been sold and is being gutted to the structure.
